This summer we are taking a journey through all the books of the Bible to look for Christ in all scriptures.

I encourage you to join us by reading through the verses selected from each book in order and come to know Christ as God's eternal plan of hope. In your small group, come together and discuss what you are learning about Jesus Christ and God's plan.

- **Genesis Seed of the Woman (3:15)**

And I will put enmity
between you and the woman,
and between your offspring and hers;
he will crush your head,
and you will strike his heel."

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **Exodus The Passover Lamb (12:11-13)**

¹¹This is how you are to eat it: with your cloak tucked into your belt, your sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand. Eat it in haste; it is the LORD's Passover. ¹²"On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn of both people and animals, and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the LORD. ¹³The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are, and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **Leviticus The Atoning Sacrifice (17:11)**

For the life of a creature is in the blood, and I have given it to you to make atonement for yourselves on the altar; it is the blood that makes atonement for one's life.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

What have you discovered this week about Jesus from these Old Testament books?

- **Numbers The Star of Jacob (24:17)**

"I see him, but not now;
I behold him, but not near.
A star will come out of Jacob;
a scepter will rise out of Israel.
He will crush the foreheads of Moab,
the skulls of all the people of Sheth."



How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **Deuteronomy The Prophet (18:15)**

The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your fellow Israelites. You must listen to him.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **Joshua The Commander of the LORD's Army (5:13-15)**

¹³ Now when Joshua was near Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing in front of him with a drawn sword in his hand. Joshua went up to him and asked, "Are you for us or for our enemies?" ¹⁴ "Neither," he replied, "but as commander of the army of the LORD I have now come." Then Joshua fell facedown to the ground in reverence, and asked him, "What message does my Lord have for his servant?" ¹⁵ The commander of the LORD's army replied, "Take off your sandals, for the place where you are standing is holy." And Joshua did so.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

Group Discussion Questions:

- Review the passages from the first four books of the Bible. How clearly does this speak to you regarding God's plan from the very beginning to redeem us from sin, death and the devil by the blood of Jesus Christ?
- Compare Deuteronomy 18:5 with the prophecy fulfilled in Mark 9:7. What should your response be to this passage?
- Look at the role of the Commander of the LORD's army in Joshua 5:13-15 with that of Jesus in John 3:16-17. How do they compare?
