- **Judges The Angel of the LORD (13:20)**

I suggest reading all of Judges Chapter 13

As the flame blazed up from the altar toward heaven, the angel of the LORD ascended in the flame. Seeing this, Manoah and his wife fell with their faces to the ground.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **Ruth Our Kinsman Redeemer (3:12)**

Although it is true that I am near of kin, there is a kinsman-redeemer nearer than I.

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **1 Samuel The Lord's Anointed (2:10)**

Those who oppose the LORD will be shattered. He will thunder against them from heaven; the LORD will judge the ends of the earth. "He will give strength to his king and exalt the horn of his anointed."

How does this passage relate to Christ?

- **II Samuel God's Promise (7:16)**

"Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me; your throne will be established forever"

- **I Kings Our Covenant of Love (8:23)**

O LORD, God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth below—you who keep your covenant of love with your servants who continue wholeheartedly in your way.

- **II Kings Ascended Lord (2:9-11)**

When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?" "Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit," Elisha replied. "You have asked a difficult thing," Elijah said, "yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours—otherwise not." As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind.
